





"Through BRI projects, China has helped build more than 6,000 kilometers of railway, over 6,000 km of highways and more than 80 large power facilities on the African continent".



"China understands what it's like to see its culture threatened, [...]. Europe denied African cultures at least until our independence in the 1960s, which is why it would have never financed such a work".
